Funding for Everyday Speech

■ **IDEA—Special Education Grants to States**

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) ensures that **children with disabilities** receive a free and appropriate education and can meet the same academic standards as other students.

■ **Title I, Parts A, C & D**

Title I provides financial assistance to schools with **high numbers of poor and migratory children** and prevents **at-risk youth** from dropping out of school to ensure that all children meet state standards.

■ **Title II**

Title II's purpose is to **prepare and recruit high-quality teachers and principals** to improve student success. This includes teacher preparation, recruitment, induction, professional development, and retention, as well as enhancing the skills and knowledge of principals for effective school leadership.

■ **Title IV, Part A**

Title IV **supports LEAs** in offering well-rounded education and fostering safe, healthy, supportive, and drug-free environments. It also helps LEAs implement mental health awareness training programs and expand access to school-based counseling and mental health programs.

■ **Title VI, Part B**

This allocates funds to two programs: the **Small, Rural School Grant Program** and the **Rural and Low Income School Program**.

■ **Title VIII of the ESEA provides Impact Aid grants**

Impact Aid provides grants to eligible school districts serving **federally connected children on military bases, Indian lands, and in subsidized housing**. Additional payments are made for federally connected children with disabilities, to be used for programs and projects to meet their special education needs.

■ **Promoting Student Resilience**

The Promoting Student Resilience program provides grants to an **LEA or consortia of LEAs**. The aim is to help them improve their ability to address the comprehensive behavioral and mental health needs of students in communities that have experienced significant civil unrest in the past 24 months.
